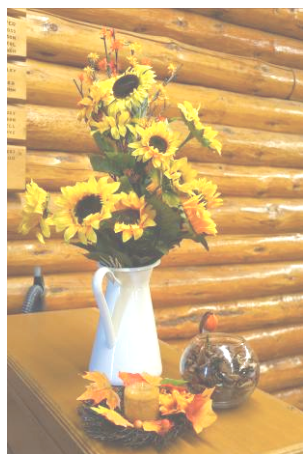

Volunteers are essential to our Society and we could not function without you. You know who you are!

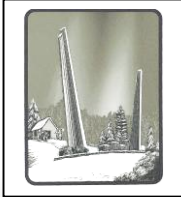

Did You Know? "George McDougall was buried in the cemetery north of the McDougall church in Morley

Alberta on 15 February 1876. A testimony to the esteem in which he was held by the Stoneys was the fact that the first monument or marker on the site of his death was erected by the Stoneys. John McDougall was appointed chairman of the Saskatchewan district by the Methodist Missionary Society, as well as continuing as missionary at Morley until 1884.
